

TRANSPORTING THE REMAINS TO INDONESIA

Indonesian Embassy in Wellington could issue a letter and legalize the documents pertaining to the transportation of the remains to be buried in Indonesia, based on the application letter from family member/relatives of the deceased or from the mortuary or funeral company. The application letter must be submitted with the following documents:

1. Death Certificate issued by Registrar of Births, Deaths & Marriages New Zealand and 4 (four) photocopies;
2. Letter issued by the District Health Board/Hospital that the deceased was not suffering from an infectious disease and 4 (four) photocopies;
3. Letter issued by Funeral Directors of Association of New Zealand/New Zealand Embalmers Association confirming that the remains have been embalmed, cavity treated and placed in sealed casket according to the international standard and 4 (four) photocopies;
4. Original passport and 4 (four) photocopies of passport of the deceased. Original passport should be kept by the Embassy;
5. Flight document/airway bill;
6. Declaration Letter from the family member/relative of the deceased who will be receiving the remains of the deceased and being held responsible for the funeral rite/ceremony in Indonesia.

Note:

1. In special cases, the Indonesian Embassy has to seal the coffin, before the remains of the deceased is going to be transported to Indonesia.
2. No fee/cost incurred upon the applicant for the letter and legalization.
