INFORMATION UPDATE ON HEALTH PROTOCOL FOR INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC (as of 9 February 2021)

In accordance with National Task Force for COVID-19 Response (Satgas COVID-19) Circular Letter Number 8 Year 2021 regarding Health Protocol for International Travel during COVID-19 Pandemic, the Embassy of the Republic of Indonesia in Helsinki wishes to inform the followings:

- 1. Indonesian nationals abroad are permitted to enter Indonesia and kindly requested to comply with strict health protocol as regulated by the Indonesian Government.
- 2. Foreign nationals are temporarily restricted to enter Indonesia from **9 February 2021** until further notice, **except for:**
 - a. foreign nationals in accordance with Ministerial Regulation of the Minister of Law and Human Rights of the Republic of Indonesia No. 26 of 2020 (please refer to Indonesian Embassy Information on Visa and Stay Permit in the New Normal dated 22 October 2020 https://kemlu.go.id/helsinki/en/news/9113/information-on-visa-and-stay-permit-in-the-new-normal);
 - b. foreign nationals permitted under Travel Corridor Arrangement (TCA) bilateral agreement scheme. Note: the Government of the Republic of Indonesia has formed TCA with United Arab Emirates (UAE), the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, and Singapore; and
 - c. foreign nationals under special consideration/ discretion and written permit from Indonesian Ministries/ Institutions.
- 3. International travelers (Indonesian nationals or foreign nationals holding valid entry permits) who enter Indonesia from any countries, directly or via transit in another country, have to show a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result from the country of origin/ departure. The negative RT-PCR test result sample has to be taken maximum 3x24 hours prior to the departure. The test result has to be shown during health check (upon arrival) and attached/ uploaded at Indonesia International e-HAC (Health Alert Card). - 4. Upon arrival in Indonesia, it is mandatory to take another COVID-19 RT-PCR test and a 5x24 hours quarantine with conditions as follows:
 - a. For Indonesian nationals (Indonesian migrant workers, students, and civil servants): quarantine is conducted at Wisma Pademangan. For other Indonesian nationals, quarantine is conducted at their own cost at appointed/ designated quarantine accommodation which have been certified for COVID-19 quarantine accommodation by the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Indonesia.
 - b. For foreign nationals: quarantine is conducted at their own cost at appointed/ designated quarantine accommodation which have been certified for COVID-19 quarantine accommodation by the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Indonesia.
- 5. Head of Missions and their families assigned in Indonesia may conduct self-isolation/ quarantine for 5x24 hours at their respective residences. Foreign diplomats and Embassy staff members,

- along with their families, have to conduct quarantine for 5x24 hours at the appointed/ designated quarantine accommodation which have been certified for COVID-19 quarantine accommodation by the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Indonesia.
- 6. After 5x24 hours of quarantine starting from the date of arrival, a second COVID-19 RT-PCR test has to be taken. If the test result is negative, the person may proceed to continue his/ her travel. He/ she is recommended to conduct a self-isolation for 14 days and comply with health protocols. If the test result is positive, Indonesian nationals will be treated in a hospital and the cost will be borne by the Indonesian Government. For foreign nationals, the cost of treatment at the hospital will be borne by themselves.
